

Florida Army National Guard concludes Best Warrior competition

Participants in the Best Warrior competition faced a series of challenges, including navigating a demanding 12-mile route while shouldering over 35 pounds of equipment. Negotiating through an obstacle course further assessed their agility and tactical prowess.
